The Public Private Infrastructure Advisory Facility (PPIAF) is a little known World Bank agency that has advocated water privatisation processes in 37 developing countries. The Dutch government is a donor to PPIAF and is hosting its 2007 annual meeting on 23-24 May in The Hague.

Civil society organizations from around the world will meet on 22-23 May to learn more about PPIAF, and to demand donors put an end to the water activities of this controversial, problematic organisation.

Planned events include a forum on donor-lead water privatization, including:

- Analysis of PPIAF as part of wider World Bank water privatisation strategy.
- Water privatisation case studies from developing countries.
- Discussion of progressive alternatives to the PPIAF approach.
